

# FLEGT VPA processes updates in the Republic of the Congo and Cameroon



### **EU FLEGT Action Plan**

- Supply and demand side measures to curb illegal logging and associated trade
- EU's wider objective of FLEGT is to encourage sustainable forest management, and to reduce degradation and deforestation considering their climate change impacts





### Rationale for entering VPA

- Cameroon:
  - maintain access to the EU market
  - align the existing IT-based system to VPA requirements
- Republic of the Congo:
  - strengthen existing controls
  - increase revenue collection

<b>VPA Timeline</b>	Cameroon (process started 2007) Congo (process started 2008)
Defining Legal Timber	Legal reforms agreed upon adopted and implemented.
Timber Legality Assurance System (TLAS)	Relevant systems elements, controls and capacity to be developed and implemented
Transparency commitments	Transparency commitments agreed upon will be implemented.
Independent Audit	Once systems elements are in place and functioning.
FLEGT Licensing scheme	Once TLAS fully operational – joint evaluation by parties to determine readiness for FLEGT Licensing.
